

READING CORNER

Is your child an active reader or does he or she just read the words without giving much thought to the ideas presented? We will take a look at some useful strategies that will develop comprehension.

This week's focus is: **VISUALISATION**

Visualisation helps a reader gain a clearer picture of what the author is describing or suggesting. When a reader can create a mental image of a scene, they become more personally involved and will be more likely to respond to the author's message.

Things you can try:

- Ask your child to talk about what they see / hear / smell / taste / touch as they read.
- Find words from the text to support the images described. This is a great way to develop vocabulary
